## **NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY (NEP) 2020 FOR B.A. FIRST YEAR STUDENTS UNDER SEMESTER SYSTEM**

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 has been implemented for undergraduate programmes by Himachal Pradesh University from the Academic Session 2026–27. Government Degree College Thachi, affiliated to Sardar Patel University (SPU), Mandi and following the curriculum adopted from Himachal Pradesh University, has introduced the NEP-2020 framework for all First Year students of B.A. programmes.

The NEP-2020 curriculum is designed to provide a flexible, multidisciplinary, skill-oriented, and learner-centric education system. It aims to promote holistic development, critical thinking, creativity, employability, entrepreneurship, and lifelong learning. The undergraduate programme follows a semester and credit-based framework with multiple entry and exit options as envisaged under NEP-2020.

The curriculum integrates academic learning with practical exposure through Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC), Value Added Courses (VAC), and Internship/Apprenticeship/Project/Community Engagement activities. Students are encouraged to explore diverse disciplines, develop professional competencies, and acquire practical skills relevant to contemporary society and the job market.

During the First Year, students shall study two Discipline Specific Courses (DSC), one Minor Course (MC), one Multidisciplinary Course (MDC), one Skill Enhancement Course (SEC), and one Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) in Semester-I. In Semester-II, students shall continue with their Discipline Specific Courses and Minor Course along with MDC, SEC, VAC, and Internship/Apprenticeship/Project/Community Engagement components as prescribed by the University.

At the end of the Second Semester, students shall identify their Major and Minor disciplines in accordance with University regulations. The programme promotes academic flexibility and interdisciplinary learning by allowing students to study courses beyond their primary discipline.

The NEP framework emphasises continuous assessment, experiential learning, digital literacy, communication skills, research aptitude, community engagement, and effective use of Information and Communication Technology (ICT). Students are encouraged to participate in

seminars, workshops, field studies, extension activities, and skill development programmes to enhance their academic and professional growth.

The undergraduate programme also incorporates the Multiple Entry and Exit System. A student may exit after successful completion of:

- One Year with an Undergraduate Certificate;
- Two Years with an Undergraduate Diploma;
- Three Years with a Bachelor's Degree; or

This innovative academic framework provides flexibility, mobility, and inclusiveness while preparing students for higher education, competitive examinations, entrepreneurship, and diverse professional careers.

### **Important Guidelines for B.A. First Year Students**

#### **Subject Pattern**

Students shall select the following courses in Semester-I:

1. Discipline Specific Course-I (DSC-I)
2. Discipline Specific Course-II (DSC-II)
3. Minor Course (MC)
4. Multidisciplinary Course (MDC)
5. Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)
6. Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)

#### **Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)**

The Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) shall be chosen from the following language options:

- English
- Hindi
- Sanskrit

### **Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)**

The Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) shall be chosen from the discipline of either DSC-I, DSC-II, or the Minor Course, subject to availability and University regulations.

### **Multidisciplinary Course (MDC)**

The Multidisciplinary Course (MDC) shall be selected from a discipline other than the student's DSC and Minor Course disciplines. The MDC is intended to promote interdisciplinary learning and broaden the academic perspective of students.

### **Example**

**DSC-I:** History

**DSC-II:** Economics

**Minor Course:** English

**MDC Options:** Hindi, Music (Instrumental), Political Science, Geography, or any other approved MDC course not overlapping with the DSC or Minor disciplines.

### **Important Note**

1. The CBCS pattern shall remain applicable only to students admitted prior to Academic Session 2026–27.
2. Students admitted in Academic Session 2026–27 and thereafter shall be governed by the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 curriculum and regulations.
3. Political Science, Geography and Music (Vocal) courses shall be offered subject to availability of teaching arrangements.
4. Course content, examination scheme and evaluation shall be governed by University regulations applicable to CBCS students.

## **ADMISSION PROCEDURE**

### **1. General Admission Procedure**

Admissions to various Undergraduate and Postgraduate programmes shall be conducted strictly in accordance with the rules and regulations prescribed by Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, and the Directorate of Higher Education, Government of Himachal Pradesh.

1. Admission forms shall be submitted online as notified by the College from time to time.
2. Candidates seeking admission must submit the prescribed application form along with all required documents within the stipulated period.
3. Admission shall be granted on the recommendation of the duly constituted Admission Committee.
4. Applicants must produce original certificates and testimonials for verification whenever required.
5. All admissions shall remain provisional until approved by University.
6. The College reserves the right to refuse or cancel admission if any information furnished by the applicant is found to be false or misleading.

### **2. Admission under Sports Quota**

Admission against the Outstanding Sports Persons Quota shall be made at the beginning of the academic session as per the roster and guidelines prescribed by Himachal Pradesh University.

The following achievements shall be considered:

- Position holders in District and School Sports Association tournaments.
- Participation/position holders at State and National level school competitions.
- Position holders in District, State and National sports tournaments recognized by competent authorities.
- Participation/position holders in State and National level tournaments organized by recognized Sports Associations.
- Participation/position holders in tournaments organized by autonomous educational bodies such as KVS, Navodaya Vidyalayas, ICSE, DAV, etc.

Candidates seeking admission under this category must also fulfill the minimum eligibility conditions prescribed for the concerned course.

### **3. Admission under Cultural Quota**

Admission against the Outstanding Cultural Activities Quota shall be made once at the beginning of the academic session in accordance with the University roster.

Eligibility:

- Students securing First, Second, Third, Highly Commended or Commended positions in Inter-School, State or National Youth Festivals during the preceding three years.
- Preference shall be given to distinctions earned in individual events over team events.
- Candidates must satisfy the minimum eligibility requirements prescribed for the respective programme.

### **4. Documents Required for Admission**

Candidates shall submit/upload the following documents:

1. Copies of all certificates and mark sheets from Matriculation onwards.
2. Character Certificate issued by the Head of the Institution last attended.
3. Original certificates for verification.
4. Passport-size photographs as prescribed by the College.
5. Migration Certificate (where applicable).
6. Eligibility Certificate from the concerned Board/University (where applicable).
7. SC/ST/OBC/EWS certificate, if applicable.
8. Bonafide Himachali Certificate, wherever required.
9. Single Girl Child Certificate, if applicable.
10. Sports/Cultural/NCC/NSS certificates, if any.
11. Anti-Ragging Undertaking as per Government and University norms.

## **5. Eligibility Conditions for Undergraduate Classes**

A candidate who has passed the 10+2 examination or an equivalent examination from a recognized Board/University shall be eligible for admission to the First Year of a Bachelor's Degree Programme subject to fulfillment of University norms.

### **Programme-wise Eligibility**

#### **Bachelor of Arts (B.A.)**

- Minimum 33% marks in 10+2 examination.

#### **Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.)**

- Minimum 45% marks in 10+2 examination.
- Candidate must have studied Mathematics or Economics at the 10+2 level.

### **Relaxations**

- SC/ST candidates shall be entitled to relaxation as per Government and University rules.
- Persons with Disabilities shall be eligible for relaxation as prescribed by the Government.

## **6. Other Eligibility Conditions**

1. Any candidate furnishing false information or forged documents shall be liable for cancellation of admission and disciplinary action.
2. Admissions are provisional until confirmed by Himachal Pradesh University.
3. The admission schedule notified by the University shall be strictly followed.
4. The decision of the Principal regarding admission matters shall be final.

## **7. Refusal of Admission**

Admission may be refused in the following circumstances:

- A candidate has failed twice in the same class/course.
- A candidate has been expelled or rusticated from any educational institution.
- A candidate has been declared ineligible by the University.

- The conduct of the candidate has been found unsatisfactory.
- The candidate fails to satisfy the eligibility conditions prescribed by the University.

### **8. Cancellation of Admission**

Admission shall be cancelled if:

- False certificates or information are submitted.
- Material facts relating to eligibility are concealed.
- Admission is found to be contrary to University rules.

The College reserves the right to initiate disciplinary and legal proceedings in such cases.

### **9. Migration Rules**

Students seeking migration from another College/University shall submit:

- Original Migration Certificate.
- Character Certificate from the institution last attended.
- Attendance Record.
- Academic Progress Report, if required.

Migration shall be governed strictly by the rules and regulations of Himachal Pradesh University.

### **10. Relaxations**

- As per Govt. Notification No. EDN&H (8)3 (7) 1/76 dated 29-06-2007, all bona fide Himachali girls are exempted from tuition fees. At the time of admission, they will compulsorily have to submit a certificate of permanent residence issued by a Competent Revenue Officer.
- Only real brothers studying in the College are entitled to get a half tuition fee exemption. Out of two, only one can apply for exemption and out of three studying simultaneously, two younger brothers can claim the same, by applying to the Principal, normally in the month of September.

## **SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE**

Eligible students may avail themselves of scholarships and financial assistance under various Government and Institutional schemes, including:

- OBC Scholarship

- Kalpana Chawla Scholarship
- Other scholarships notified by Government agencies from time to time.

### **LEAVE RULES**

Leave shall be sanctioned on the prescribed application form obtainable from the College Library. The application should be duly signed by the parents/guardians. Leave shall be granted only on the recommendation of the concerned teachers. Leave for more than a day shall be granted on the basis of a Medical Certificate issued by a Registered Medical Officer.

### **ZERO TOLERANCE TO RAGGING**

Ragging is a cognizable offence as per the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and the Himachal Pradesh Educational Institutions (Prohibition of Ragging) Act, 2009. Government Degree College Thachi maintains a zero-tolerance policy towards ragging. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within and outside the college campus.

Under the Act, *ragging* means doing any act, by disorderly conduct, to a student of an educational institution which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm, or raises apprehension, fear, shame, or embarrassment. Such conduct includes teasing, abusing, playing practical jokes, causing hurt, or compelling a student to perform any act that he/she would not ordinarily be willing to do.

Any student found guilty of committing, abetting, participating in, or propagating ragging shall be liable for disciplinary action and punishment, including:

- Imprisonment for a term which may extend up to three years;
- A fine which may extend up to ₹50,000;
- Expulsion from the College or suspension from classes for a specified period;
- Withholding of scholarships, fellowships, or other benefits;
- Debarring from representing the College in academic, cultural, sports, or other events;
- Withholding of examination results;
- Requirement of a public apology;
- Legal proceedings under the relevant criminal law and statutory provisions.

Any student convicted of ragging shall be dismissed from the College and shall not be eligible for admission to any other educational institution for a period of three years from the date of dismissal.
